Examples of Course Sequences for Undergraduates

All Wharton Undergraduates must complete 37 required course units (cus) to meet graduation requirements. The standard course load is 4 to 5 cus per semester.

Students will have differing schedules depending on a variety of factors, including AP/IB/A-Level credits, transfer credits and study abroad courses. It is important to meet with your academic advisor each semester to discuss your interests and academic plan.

Example of a First-Year Student's Schedule

Fall

ECON 001
MATH 103 or MATH 104 or STAT 101
Writing Seminar
MGMT 100
Foreign Language or
General Education/elective course

Spring

ECON 002
MATH 104 or STAT 101 or STAT 102
Writing Seminar (if not completed in fall)
OPIM 101
General Education/elective course

- First-year students are generally encouraged to register for five courses in the fall term.
- All courses in the fall term must be for a letter grade (no Pass/Fail), with a maximum of 5.5 cu's total.
- Other recommended courses for first-year students are: Global Environment courses, General Education Distribution courses, Freshman Seminars, LGST 101 and LGST 210.

Example of a Second-Year Student's Schedule

Fall

2 – 3 Business Fundamentals
1 – 2 other courses

Spring

2 – 3 Business Fundamentals
1 – 2 other courses

- There are different ways to prioritize completion of the business fundamentals depending on individual student needs and interests. Students are strongly encouraged to work with their advisor to build an academic plan that meets their goals and ensures that degree requirements are being met.
- Other recommended courses for second-year students are: Global Environment courses, General Education Distribution courses, LGST 101, LGST 210 and BPUB 203.
- Students should consider the appropriate balance between business and non-business courses in the second year. Consult with an advisor to discuss the best balance for you.

Example of a Third and Fourth-Year Student's Schedule

During the third and fourth years of study, students will be finalizing their concentration choice, considering a possible minor and/or planning to study abroad. The remaining curriculum requirements will be distributed throughout the remaining semesters.
